



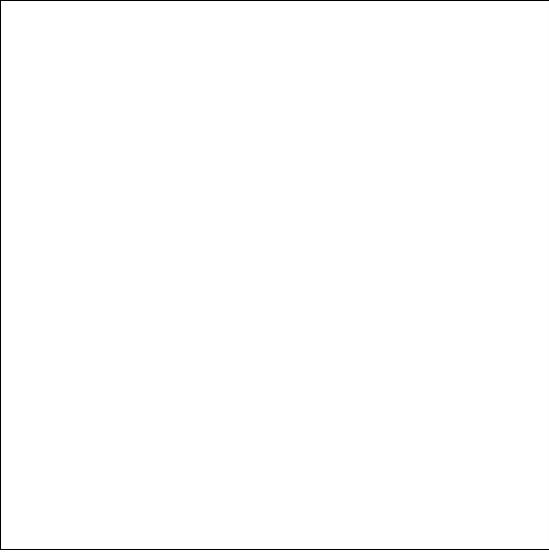
One day, Rabbit was walking by the

no kurya ibyatsi bbyiza bbyicyatsi.






