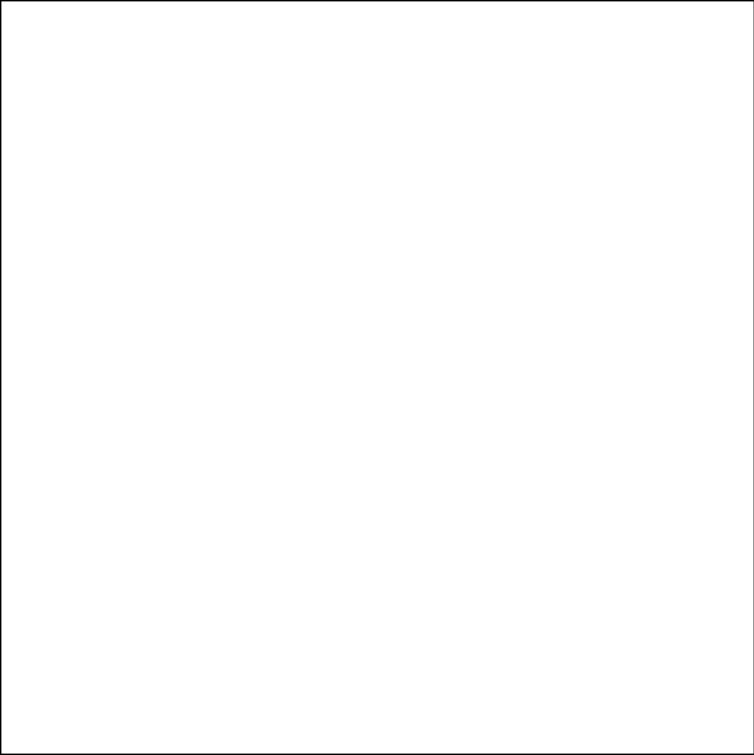
One day, Rabbit was walking by the riverside.

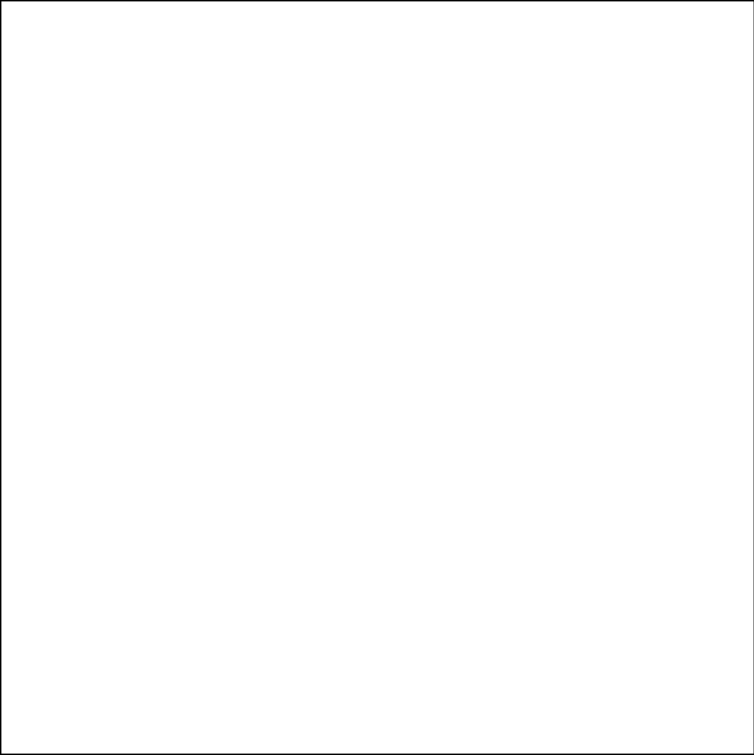
Hippo was there too, going for a stroll and

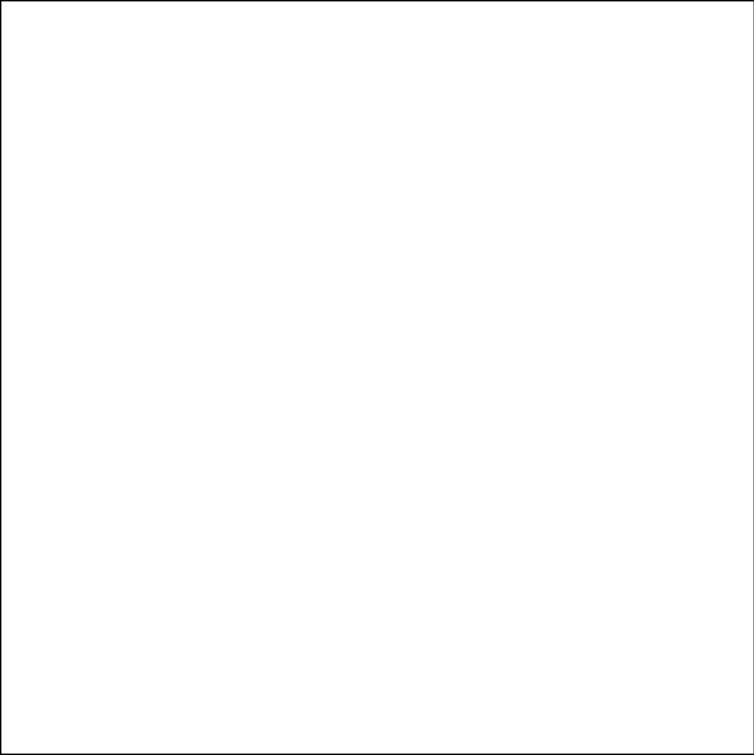
Hippo didn't see that Rabbit was there and

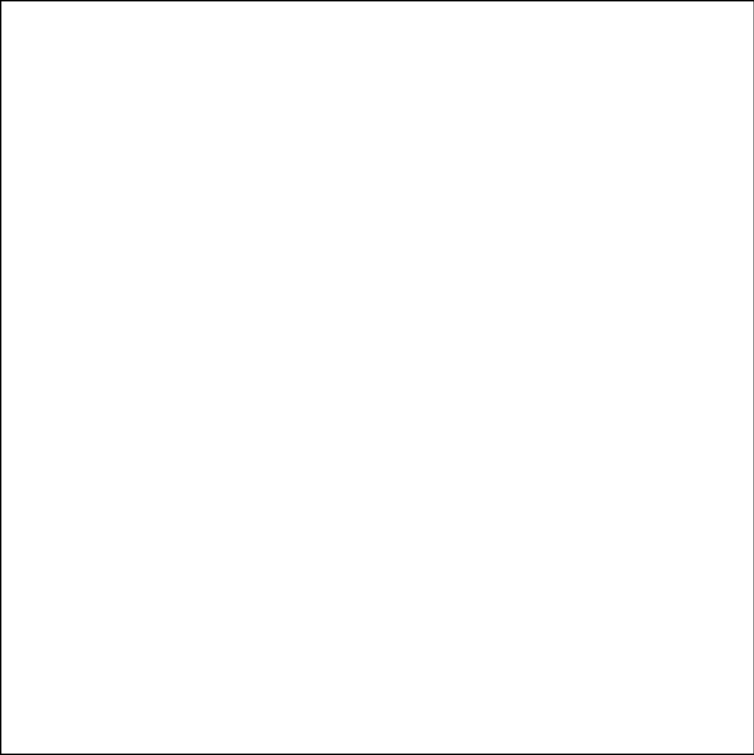

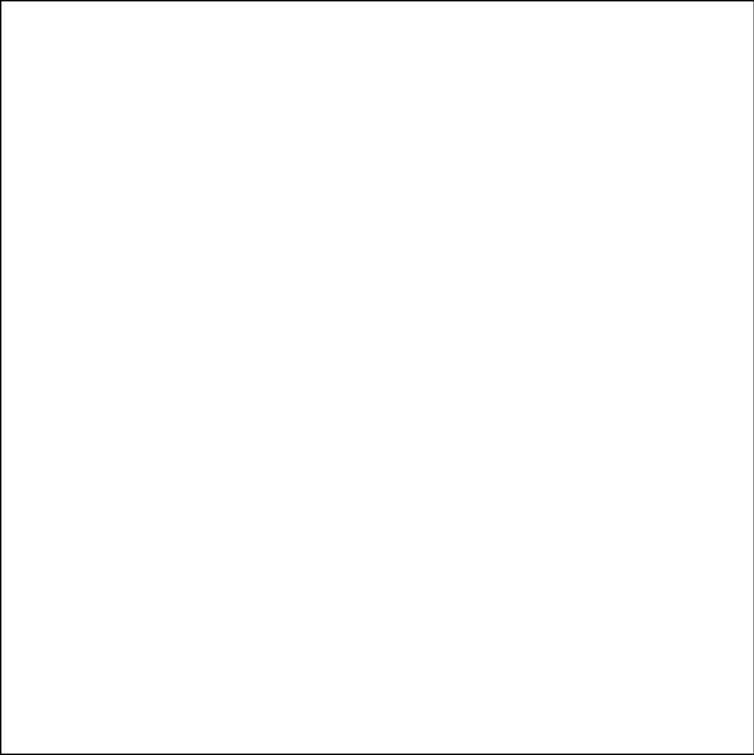
Later, Hippo was eating grass far from the river when, “Whoosh!” Fire burst into flame. The flames began to burn Hippo’s hair.
